### **ROSATOM's statement on the Lithuanian parliamentary inquiry findings**

ROSATOM refutes the allegations of unlawful activities which have been made in the recently released findings of the parliamentary inquiry by the National security and defence committee of the Lithuanian parliament.

In our international business we follow the highest standards of ethics and corporate citizenship. ROSATOM operates in 44 countries across the world in strict compliance with the applicable laws. ROSATOM has a zero-tolerance policy on corruption and never conducts or authorises on its behalf any activity which could be reasonably considered 'unlawful influence'.

There is no single fact in the inquiry files to suggest that ROSATOM has ever acted not in good faith or had any malign intent. The contracts for all the works and services ROSATOM's EU subsidiaries are now carrying out in Lithuania were signed back in 2005, long before ROSATOM acquired those EU companies in 2009.

The consistent position of ROSATOM as a global leader in the nuclear sector is that international cooperation in clean energy and climate should be partitioned off from political spin as well as from the vicissitudes of geopolitics.

Our efforts, aimed at the promotion of international cooperation in the low carbon energy sector and public acceptance of nuclear, are transparent, legitimate and fair.

ROSATOM stands ready to cooperate fully with any inquiry and would welcome the opportunity to contribute to addressing any alleged illegal activities.
